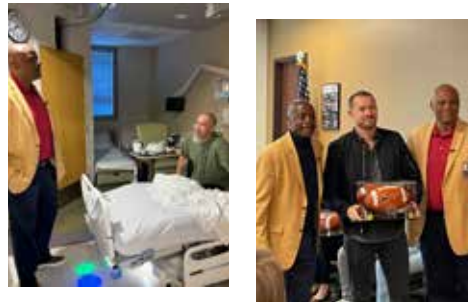
SILVERSUMMIT HEALTHPLAN AND PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME HOLD 'SALUTE TO SERVICE 2024' EVENT HONORING LOCAL MILITARY PERSONNEL AND FIRST RESPONDERS
